Diane Venenga called the meeting to order.

Diane Venenga stated the proceedings are being recorded and reminded Council members that they are to abstain from participating in and/or voting on any action items involving a potential conflict of interest.

Diane Venenga began with the welcome and introductions of the Academy Council, ILEA staff and guests.

Diane Venenga determined there was a quorum.

The first item (#1*) on the agenda was the disclosure of potential conflicts of interest on the Open Session agenda. There were none.

The second item (#2*) on the agenda was the election of the Chair and Vice Chair of the Academy Council.

Reason for Waiver: Call is a certified officer in North Dakota. He initially secured a bachelor's degree in Natural Resources Law Enforcement in Minnesota. He then attended Minnesota's Law Enforcement Skills Program, which was 360 hours. He was certification eligible when he earned reciprocity in North Dakota and became certified there after completing 76 hours in criminal and traffic law. He has served as a certified officer for North Dakota Parks & Recreation for 1 year. He would like to acquire Iowa certification through the CTE program.

Reason for Waiver: Hyduke is a certified officer in California. He attended their 600- hour academy, and later obtained his intermediate, advanced, supervisory and management certificates during his 30 years of law enforcement experience. He also has a MA in criminal justice and taught criminal justice courses at a junior college. Hyduke retired from CA law enforcement on April 7, 2011. He has not been employed in law enforcement for about 12 ½ years. He would like to acquire Iowa certification through the CTE program.

Reason for Waiver: Officer Spomer lives in Blair, Nebraska with his wife and children. He serves as a High Risk Unit for the Fourth Judicial Iowa Department of Corrections. Two other DOC employees also live in Nebraska due to the high number of arrests the Unit makes with individuals on probation/parole in the Council Bluffs community. If he cannot reside in Nebraska, he would be unable to remain in his position.

The eleventh item (#11*) on the agenda was ILEA Reports:

- a) Update on the 311 and 312 Basic Classes
 Director Carney advised that ILEA currently has 78 recruits and they are doing well.
- b) Update on Regional Academies Donna advised that all five academies are in session at this time. Donna and AD Poole will be meeting with Indian Hills next week to discuss curriculum for their new Level II Regional Academy that will start in 2024.
- c) Update on Specialty Schools Katy Fukuda updated the Council on upcoming specialty schools and a look ahead to what is coming in the future. ILEA will continue to offer several classes across the state.

The twelfth item (#12*) on the agenda was oral arguments for Case Appeal (22-037)

Attorney Mark Hedberg introduced himself and gave the Council a brief summary of his experience. Doug Twigg, current Chief of Police for the Woodward Police Department, introduced himself and gave a brief background of his law enforcement experience.

Mr. Hedberg and Doug Twigg were given ten minutes to present their oral arguments. Mr. Hedberg advised the Council that the ALJ in this case did not think a full decertification was warranted, rather, a six-month suspension would be sufficient. Mr. Hedberg is requesting a 3-4 day suspension. Mr. Hedberg voiced his concerns with Mr. Twigg's due process in this matter and argues the fact that Mr. Twigg was not given the chance to present his case initially. Mr. Hedberg stated that Mr. Twigg's false statement under oath was a mistake and was not intentional. When Mr. Twigg was in the hiring process for the Chief of Police position for Woodward, he was totally honest and upfront with the Mayor regarding his case. The Mayor spoke to the Council and stated that Mr. Twigg has been an asset to his city and he has had zero problems since Mr. Twigg has been Chief.

Assistant Attorney General, Kristi Traynor, advised the Council that she is representing the State of Iowa in this case. AAG Traynor was advised that she had ten minutes to present her oral arguments. Mr. Dirth, AAG, is present to represent the Academy Council. AAG Traynor explained for the Council that both parties appealed the sanction, however, the state has also appealed two other aspects of the proposed decision. The first aspect is: The ALJ found that the State did not meet its burden of proof with respect to the charge for an allegation of moral turpitude. The State argues that the statement made cannot be "material" for one count, but not for the other and is asking the Council to overturn that decision. The second aspect is: the State believes that the language used on page 24, first paragraph, last sentence of the proposed decision, is inappropriate. This refers to the statement of "shoot you in the face". The ALJ stated these comments were "understandable in the high pressure, stressful situation". The State is asking the Council to remove the condoning language of significant behaviors contrary to the standards and teaching in the law enforcement field. The third request from the State is that the sanction proposed by the ALJ be overturned and a full decertification be given. AAG Traynor found it problematic that Chief Twigg has not been forthcoming with the Dallas County Attorney's Office regarding the Brady-Giglio issues and has not accepted responsibility for his actions which is a continuing harm to the public. She advised that the purpose of a sanction is not to punish the officer, however, it is to protect the public.

The thirteenth item (#13*) on the agenda was to move into Closed Session.

Diane Venenga entertained a motion. Sadie Weekley made a motion that the Council go into closed session for the purpose of discussing closed session minutes, whether to initiate licensee disciplinary investigations or proceedings, to discuss the decisions to be rendered in a contested case conducted according to the provisions of chapter 17A, pursuant to Iowa Code sections 21.5(1)(a), (d), and (f). Gene Beinke seconded the motion. A group voice vote was taken. 11-Aye, motion carried.

The fourteenth item (#14*) on the agenda was to vote on items discussed in the Closed Session.
